In 2007, the Community Foundation awarded over \$475,000 in grants to local projects and scholarships to students. In addition, the Community Foundation launched XFUND to encourage those in their 20s, 30s and 40s to become involved with the Community Foundation and to give to the community through service. The XFUND awarded their first grant in 2007 to Youth Encouraging Philanthropy.

Bart Beal and Dawn Horth presented the Duke Energy Technical Trade Scholarship to Zachary Reckas. Zackary inspired the crowd when he said, "When you want something -- go after it!" The Lilly Endowment Community Scholarship Recipients and the Avon Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery Scholarship Recipients were also recognized.

Family Philanthropy: *Holding a Dinner Table Foundation Meeting*

What you'll need: an easel or pad of newsprint, markers, memo pads and pencils for each family member; mailings requesting donations; play money (optional).

1. Decide in advance of the meeting what amount your family will give to charity.

2. If your children are young, you should also predetermine how funding decisions will be made (e.g. each family member picks his or her own charities, the family votes on them as a group,

or a combination of the two methods). If your children are older, they may want to participate in devising the plan.

3. Set the time and place for the family meeting. At that time, turn off the TV, let the answering machine catch your phone calls and take other steps as necessary to ensure you aren't interrupted by distractions.

4. On the top of the easel or large pad, post the amount of money you plan to have the family allocate to charity.

5. Explain how the decisions will be made.

6. List the preferences of each family member on the pad.

7. Use the play money to help the kids visualize how the money could be divided among the chosen charities.

8. Vote on which organizations to fund and in what amounts.

9. Let the kids help you write the checks.

Note: When your children are very young, keep the meeting brief (20 minutes for kindergartners) and limit the choices of charities to three or four that are likely to appeal to them (e.g. the local animal shelter). Don't focus on the amounts to be given until they are old enough to understand money.

Community Foundation Grant Cycle

Each year, the Community Foundation invites local charitable groups and nonprofit organizations to submit grant proposals through the Opportunity Fund Grant Cycle. The Community Foundation will announce grants from this fund in August.

The Opportunity Fund is an endowed unrestricted fund which allows the Community Foundation to grant to programs and organizations each year according to the changing needs of the community. It was created and continues to grow from endowed unrestricted gifts to the Community Foundation. The value of endowed unrestricted gifts is that they are perpetual -- lasting many years beyond a donor's lifetime -- and are managed by a skilled group of community citizens to meet unanticipated community needs. Unrestricted gifts are an essential resource for the Community Foundation because today's most pressing needs are not likely to be tomorrow's future needs.

New Funds Established

The Community Foundation is pleased to announce two new **Grow Your Legacy Funds**. Those funds are the:

Sally Dillon Haver Seeding Fund

Max and Jill Poynter Family Seeding Fund

These endowed funds will grow through regular contributions invested for growth and income and will award grants to community organization and projects forever.

The Hendricks County Convention and Visitors Bureau has established an endowed scholarship fund for Hendricks County residents. Two scholarships will be awarded: one for a graduating senior and the other for an adult working toward a degree in the field of tourism. The first scholarships will be awarded in May 2009.

Because Jenny was a teacher and life-long learner, this donor advised fund will be used for a variety of educational projects.

Gladys V. (Nickell) Pritchett was honored by her daughter and son-in-law, Janet and Tim Whiteman with an endowed scholarship fund. Gladys has been an educator since 1939. As her granddaughter said about her grandmother, "She continues to be a strong supporter of advanced education. She is humbled and surprised by the naming of this fund,

but appreciates how others obtaining education degrees may benefit from the annual scholarship." This scholarship will be awarded annually to a Hendricks County graduating senior who is going to attend college to pursue a career in education and preference will be given to a student wanting to be a math teacher.

Youth Encouraging Philanthropy is a new group formed by a combination of the YES group and the Hendricks County Youth Leadership alumni. They will learn about philanthropy and sharing their knowledge with younger students. The YEP endowed fund was created from the Youth Encouraging Society and the Hendricks County Youth Philanthropy Fund.

One of these grants allowed a third grade class at Mill Creek West to participate in “The Flat Stanley Project.” Teacher Linda Rasner wrote, “Thank you for your generosity in funding ‘The Flat Stanley Project’ through the

grant monies set aside by our dear, dear friend, Jackie. We know he would be excited to see the children engaged in a project that enhanced their school experience and broadened their perspective.”
