## Creating Opportunities Supporting Community

As the year is coming to a close and the Hendricks County Community Foundation begins preparing for 2011, we are excited to announce the recipients of our 2010 Deedee Daniel Opportunity Fund grants. The grants, totaling \$57,592, will benefit charitable organizations that enhance the community, help those in need or provide educational opportunities. These 19 recipient organizations service thousands of residents in our community.

The projects that the grant money will benefit range from a grassroots effort to provide pajamas to children in need to transportation for the elderly and disabled as well as the expansion of Sheltering Wings.

Kingsway Community Care Center (KCCC) provides medical and dental services to the uninsured and underserved in our community. They will use the grant to enhance

their fundraising efforts to enable them to reach a greater percentage of our uninsured neighbors. One of the Care Center patients with diabetes shared, "[KCCC] very possibly saved my life, and it gives so many other people in Hendricks County hope that someone out there

really cares." Another patient wrote, "If it wasn't for [KCCC] I would be well on my way to my grave. They gave me a chance, hope, and the ability to change my life. Friendly staff and knowledgeable doctors make this the perfect place to turn to when you need that desperate hand up."

The Hendricks County libraries grant dollars will bring together patrons from all six county libraries to read, enjoy and explore one book, *Three Cups of Tea* by Greg Mortenson. Each of the six libraries will host at least one educational event, book discussion or cultural

activity. Joanna Carter from the Plainfield Guildford Township Library stated, "One Book, One County is a great opportunity for the community to build a better understanding of the Afghanistan and Pakistan cultures. It brings people together to open up

discussion about what we can do to help people half a world away by collecting pennies to promote education and peace in the Middle East." This grant will help to promote cultural awareness, recognize diversity, inspire community action, share common experience and broaden horizons.

## One Date May Save You Thousands

One date may save you thousands when it comes to paying for college. The Community Foundation recently made a grant to the National Center for College Costs (NCCC) to continue to provide assistance to Hendricks County students and their parents preparing for college.

Whether it's pursuing a degree at the community college level or a bachelor's degree at a four-year institution, NCCC educates families of all backgrounds that college is an option they CAN afford. The Community Foundation has worked with NCCC since 1999 to provide the College Cost Estimator to all Hendricks County residents for FREE and, last year, added FAFSA Days at each county high school.

FAFSA, Free Application for Federal and State Aid, is a form that can be prepared annually by current and prospective college students to determine their eligibility

Last year, students and their parents who completed their FAFSA during FAFSA Days at one of the Hendricks County High Schools were able to draw down \$740,532 in federal and state grant dollars or an average of over \$4,500 in aid for each student. All of these savings were brought to the county parents and students at **NO COST** because of the grant from the Community Foundation. One parent commented on their local FAFSA Day celebrating, "I [now] feel our daughter has the ability to attend any college."

In 2011, FAFSA Days will be offered again thanks to another grant by the Community Foundation as well as the generosity of several partners --- North Salem State Bank, State Bank of Lizton, Hendricks College Network, First National Bank and Brownsburg Education Foundation. Experts will be on hand to help students and their parents complete

for student federal and state financial aid. To be eligible for state and federal financial aid, a student must file a FAFSA by the March 10 deadline. FAFSA can be found online at [www.fafsa.ed.gov](http://www.fafsa.ed.gov).

Estimator. The Estimator is NCCC's unique format analysis of a client family's financial situation under the Federal Methodology used to determine need-based financial aid. NCCC provides families with personalized strategies and advice on how to make the numbers work and take the fear out of the college cost issue.

The College Cost Estimator is **FREE** because of the Community Foundation's partnership with North Salem State Bank, State Bank of Lizton, Hendricks College Network, First National Bank and Brownsburg Education Foundation. The Estimator can be found online at [www.collegecosts.com](http://www.collegecosts.com) and is FREE to all Hendricks County residents.

The estimator may be filled out online at any time. The

customized analysis will be distributed at the College Costs Estimator Workshop on Thursday, April 7, at 6:30 p.m. at the Hendricks County 4-H Fairgrounds and Conference Center. If unable to attend the workshop, the Estimator will be mailed to the address provided. NCCC will also provide ongoing guidance through the financial aid process.

No matter the age of your child, you may complete an Estimator. You may then update it for free each year to monitor your progress toward a wide array of post-high school options. And in the words of one parent, "There is hope!"

## New Funds

### **Hendricks County AgrlInstitute Fund**

This fund was established to provide support to the AgrlInstitute and its Indiana Agricultural Leadership Program.

### **Clarian West Cancer Center Fund**

This fund was created by Clarian West to assist cancer patients receiving treatment at Clarian West. This patient assistance fund will be used to help pay for things such as gas cards, grocery gift cards, co-pays for prescriptions, emergent dental care prior to starting radiation therapy, other household needs, and accessibility to home or treatment.

### **Jordan's Place Endowment Fund**

This endowed fund was established by Jordan's Place to provide necessary resources for those families who have foster children.

### **Krampen Family Fund**

This fund was established by Jim and Linda Krampen to provide grants to charitable organizations and projects in Hendricks County.

### **SCI Hope Endowment Fund**

This fund was established by John and Tammie Wassen and Jim and Skip Tennancour after John suffered a spinal cord injury. The purpose of the fund is to provide independence and quality of life through

financial grants to individuals with spinal cord injuries.

### **Westside Secondary Transition Council Fund**

This fund was established by the members of the Westside Secondary Transition Council, which is made up of representatives from Avon, Plainfield, Danville, Brownsburg, Ben Davis Schools and Sycamore Services. The purpose of the fund shall be to provide support to the Westside Secondary Transition Council to facilitate transition into adulthood for children with disabilities.

### **World Trade Center Memorial Project Fund**

This fund was created to provide support to the World Trade Center Memorial Project by the Brownsburg Fire Territory and Local 4406. The Brownsburg Fire Territory and Local 4406 purchased a piece of steel from the 9/11 disaster to make a memorial display. This will be the only memorial of this type in the State of Indiana.

## Feeding the Hungry One Deer at a Time

Meat is one of the most difficult things to stock at food pantries. Many local food pantries do not have the resources to supply their patrons with meat products. Thankfully, the Hendricks County chapter of Farmers & Hunters Feeding the Hungry (FHFH) has joined forces with the Hendricks County Food Pantry Coalition Fund (a fund of the Hendricks County

Community Foundation) to stock our local pantries with much needed meat.

How do they do it? With a growing population of deer, many are discarded during hunting season. However, Farmers & Hunters Feeding the Hungry has decided to utilize this surplus in order to provide venison to the local food pantries. A donation

of \$68 will cover the processing fee at a licensed and approved local meat processor for one deer to be packaged and delivered to one of the many Hendricks County food pantries. This \$68 donation can provide nearly 200 meals to hungry families in the county.

A national organization, FHFH is an outreach ministry of the

people of God called upon to feed venison to the hungry among us nationwide. The Hendricks County chapter is lead by Donald Emry of Plainfield.

## Clarian West Creates Cancer Center Fund
